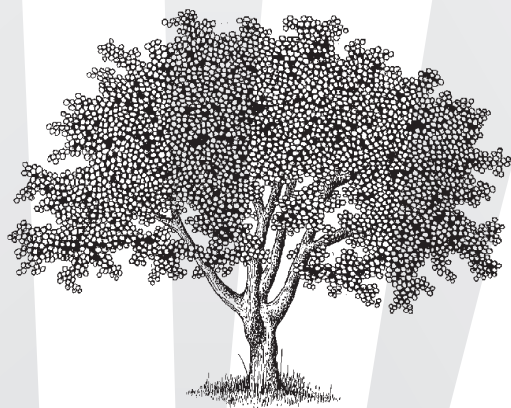

**Final Record of Land Sales in Medina  
County Probate Court Records**

covers the sale of land belonging to incompetents and minor children where one or both parents died intestate (without a will.) Also, they cover instances where land was put up as collateral or surety bond (to guarantee completion of a contract.) The content of these records varies greatly. Microfilm reels #67-73 cover the years 1852-1902. The microfilm quality is good, although the handwriting sometimes is difficult to read. Each of the volumes on the microfilm has its own alphabetical index.

**Grantors Index to Deeds  
from Trumbull, Portage, Medina  
and Stark Counties 1795-1840**

is on microfilm reel number 74a. This is a typed index that is arranged alphabetically by the grantor's (seller's) name. It only covers the townships that became part of Summit County when it was formed in 1840. Richfield, Copley, Bath, Coventry, and Norton are the townships that Medina County relinquished when Summit was formed. The index lists: grantor's name, grantee's name, volume and page number of the deed, township name, lot number, section number, number of acres, and the amount of the sale. The form is set up for Portage County, so the other counties names are typed in. For townships that are currently part of Medina County, see the index below.

**Deed Index for Record of Deeds  
of Medina County 1818-1923**

is on microfilm reel numbers 75-79. These indexes cover volumes A through 110 of the actual deeds. This is a handwritten alphabetical index. The quality of the microfilm and the handwriting varies. The index includes: date, name, whether the land was conveyed to or from, the name of the second individual involved in the sale, the volume and page number of the actual deed, date of the record, township number, tract number, lot number, and number of acres transferred. If the page is completely filled, look for a note at the bottom of the page telling where the records are continued.

**Record of Deeds of  
Medina County 1790-1871**

is on microfilm reel numbers 80-110, covering Volume A through 26 of the actual deeds. Information in the deeds includes: name and residence of the seller, name and residence of the buyer, dollar amount of the transaction, description of the property, including the boundaries and number of acres, and the date of the transaction. If the seller is a resident of the State of Ohio, the seller's wife's name is also included.



All of our land records are on microfilm.
