Label to Learn

Labeling common items around your home is a perfect literacy activity to prepare your child for reading. Label the refrigerator, door, trash can, sink, bed – label whatever you can think of using sticky notes or index cards. As your child sees these words around your home, the words become more familiar. Point to the label often and read the word out loud, reinforcing the association between the written and spoken word.
