Fall Fun with Leaves

Autumn is a fun time to take your child on a nature walk to collect fall leaves. Visit a park or walk around the neighborhood gathering leaves. Talk about what you see. These conversations introduce new vocabulary and build children's powers of observation. Gather a pile of colorful leaves and explore your finds together.

- **Sort leaves by color.** How many did you find of each color? Which color did you find the most?
- **Compare their sizes.** Make different piles for small and large leaves.
- **Observe their shapes.** Some leaves have several tips, and some are oval with only one tip.
- **Discuss how they feel.** Are they smooth? Rough?
- Explore your engineering skills. What can you build out of the leaves? A house? A design?
- Move your body like a leaf. How would it move in the wind? Or fall off of a high tree?
- **Create art.** Rub a leaf with crayons. Use leaves as a paint brush. Make a collage. Poke holes in them.




